

Proposed improvements will include the addition of left turn lanes, eastbound and westbound, along West Church Street. The expansion of the turn radii at the intersection between Pine Street and Church Street and the re-signalization of the intersection. The project was estimated to cost \$920,000 in 2014 which included engineering, project and construction management fees. During the 2014 Pennies for Progress referendum ranking, this project was #2 in Lexington County.

The expansion will also include an increase of three of the four turn radii, as well as the realignment of the intersection of Mitchell Street and Church Street. The project was estimated to cost \$850,000 in 2014, which included engineering, project and construction management fees. During the 2014 Pennies for Progress referendum ranking, this project was #8 in Lexington County.

North Oak Street resurfacing

The proposed roadway rehabilitation will include approximately 4,400 square yards of full depth pavement removal and replacement and 2,800 square yards of two inch cold mill and asphalt surface course overlay along North Oak Street.
