ISO FIRE CLASSIFICATION REVIEW

• At least every 5 years, ISO performs a survey known as Public Protection Classification (PPC) to determine our ISO rating for Fire Service. This rating plays a large role in the rates that people pay for insurance. ISO performed the survey/inspection earlier this year and we received our results this past week. We have remained a ISO Class 3 for Fire Service. This is a very good rating, with one being the overall best you can receive and 10 being the worst.

PROJECT UPDATES

- Wastewater Treatment Plant projects are in the winding down phase. They aeration projects are complete and final payments made for those two basin projects. The headworks project is entering final stages as final electrical work is all but complete, screw pumps are in operation and the digester tank will be started here soon. That will complete this project. The liquid chemical feed project is currently out for bid. We will be opening bids for this project on November 22nd and will bring to Council in December for awarding.
- In follow up to our last Council meeting, Dominion Energy has informed me that they
 have our Town scheduled for November to mobilize in and begin changing all of our
 streetlights from HID to LED. They have not provided a timeline on how long the
 conversion will take.
- AOS Specialty Contractors, who will be installing the new sidewalks from Columbia Farms to Walmart along Highway 23, told us this week that their plan is to begin work on October 17th. There is a slight possibility that it may be October 24th, but their plan is for the 17th. They have until June 30th to complete the project.
- Our Invitation to bid for the Infiltration and Inflow rehabilitation project is currently out and bids are due in by November 9th at 2:00pm, in which we will have the bid opening. We are having a mandatory pre-bid meeting on October 19th for any contractors who want to bid on the project. Our goal is to have this on the agenda for the next Council meeting.
