MAYOR'S REPORT

UPDATE - BURLINGTON PLANT

Mr. Tony Gregory, Region Engineer for Public Services, and assigned as the engineer for the Batesburg building spoke on the old Burlington plant. He stated the property is 14 acres with 6 acres under roof and the 100 year old building is very complex. We are in the process of getting the building demolished but will take a few years. We have done asbestos sampling and the next step is to remove regulated materials which will happen this summer or early fall which will take the rest of the year. Next year will be a lot of permitting; the asbestos removal and demolition and will need storm water approval with the actual demolition in 2016. Stated the building has been secured and a maintenance program has started.
